Henry John Van Zee entered into glory with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on November 25, 2020.

Henry was born on September 23, 1930, in Orange City, IA. As the youngest child and only son of Anthony and Gertrude (Ver Hoeven) Van Zee, Henry attended country school from kindergarten through seventh grade, Newkirk High School for a year, then Hospers High School, graduating in 1948. In 1951, he spent one year attending Commercial Extension Business College in Omaha, NE, before enlisting in the U.S. Navy.

In 1955, at the conclusion of his four-year Navy enlistment, Henry met Ruth Vermeer. After a short courtship they were married on October 21, 1955, in Bellflower, CA. Three children followed: Richard Lee (1957), Brenda Kay (1959), and Kristi Lynn (1969).

After marriage, Henry sought employment as a machinist, a skill he learned in the navy. He worked as a machinist until receiving training as computer programmer. He retired in March 1992.

After both Henry and Ruth retired, they spent 16 years traveling in their RVs, seeing all 50 states. Their friends joined these expeditions and together they had many adventuresome trips. Additionally, they volunteered one month each year at Cook College and Theological School in Tempe, AZ. During that time they met other friends from all over the United States who volunteered with them.

Henry and Ruth faithfully attended Bethel Reformed Church in Bellflower for

over 50 years where they became involved with Couples Club. Henry also served for 19 years as both elder and deacon. In 2006, they became members of Bethany Christian Reformed Church in Bellflower.
